ORDINANCE 17-O- 32**

**ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF WILLOW SPRINGS
AMENDING TITLE 4, CHAPTER 3, SECTION 9 OF THE WILLOW SPRINGS
VILLAGE CODE.**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE BOARD OF THE VILLAGE OF WILLOW SPRINGS, ILLINOIS:

SECTION 1: The following changes are hereby made to Section 4-3-9 of the Willow Springs Municipal Code (additions underlined and deletions noted with ~~striketrough~~ text):

4-3-9: LICENSE CLASSIFICATIONS, FEES, NUMBER OF LICENSES:

Licenses to sell alcoholic liquor at retail shall be of the following classes:

[...]

- H. Class E License: A class E license shall be a temporary permit for the sale at retail of alcoholic liquor at any banquet, picnic, bazaar, fair or similar assembly where food or drink is sold, served or dispensed. Such temporary permits shall be issued only to any business within the corporate limits of Willow Springs which currently holds a valid liquor license or an organized church, society, fraternal or benevolent organization organized or conducted not for pecuniary profit as determined by the local commissioner or any entity approved by local commissioner. Such temporary permits shall not permit the sale of any alcoholic liquors in any place where the sale thereof is prohibited by law or by ordinance of the village. Such permits shall be issued for a specific location, with a closing hour of eleven o'clock (11:00) P.M. The fee for such temporary permits shall be ~~six hundred~~ fifty dollars (~~\$600.00~~ 50.00) per day and said permits shall permit the licensee to sell at retail said alcoholic liquors only for a period of four (4) days or less. There shall be no fee for any not for pecuniary profit organization as determined by the local liquor commissioner. Said period to be designated by dates in said license. There shall be no restriction as to the number of class E licenses issued and outstanding in the village at any one time. Every application for a class E license shall be accompanied by a certificate of insurance naming the village as an additional insured thereon issued by a company or companies acceptable to the local commissioner evidencing the existence of the following policies of insurance:

1. Liquor liability insurance in accordance with the Illinois liquor control act with minimum limits of one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) bodily injury, per person and per occurrence; and five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000.00) property damage; and
2. A comprehensive general liability policy of insurance with minimum limits of one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) bodily injury and property damage, per person and per occurrence.

[...]

SECTION 2: This Ordinance shall not be held to repeal a former ordinance as to any offense committed against the former ordinance or as to any act done, any penalty, forfeiture or punishment so incurred, or any right accrued or claim arising under the former ordinance, or in any way whatsoever affect any such offense or act so committed or so done, or any penalty, forfeiture or punishment so incurred to any right accrued to claims arising before this Ordinance takes effect, save only that the proceedings thereafter shall conform to the ordinance in force at the time of such proceedings, as far as practicable.

SECTION 3: That if any part or parts of this Ordinance shall be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity of the remaining parts of this Ordinance. The Village Board declare hereby that they would have passed the remaining parts of this Ordinance, if they had known that such part or parts thereof would be declared unconstitutional.

SECTION 4: The Village Clerk of the Village of Willow Springs is directed hereby to publish this Ordinance in pamphlet form.


SECTION 5: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet form.


