
Place your branches (no more than 3 inches in diameter & 6 feet in length) in the easement. Village code only allows us to spend no more than ten minutes at each household to chip clippings. Public Works does not chip full trees or branches from full trees. You or your contractor is responsible for removing from your property full trees or parts of full trees. Public Works is not able to chip branches from pine trees due to the sap on the branches.

Mixing yard waste with branches will break down village equipment. Public Works <u>will not</u> pick up branches if they are mixed with yard waste.

After October 1, all remaining branches may be disposed through Groot Recycling in the brown waste bags with a lawn waste sticker. The stickers can be purchased at the Village Hall for \$2.70 each. Please store larger branches inside your yard so they may be chipped in the spring.

## Village Prepares for Busy Schedule of Infrastructure Improvements

The Village of Willow Springs is undertaking several exciting projects within the community. The Village is working on sidewalk, road, parking lot, and drainage improvements throughout the Village. The projects will address several areas in need of improvement that will improve functionality of facilities, aesthetic improvements, and enhance the quality of life for residents within the community. Highlight projects include:

"Willow Walks" is a 'Safe Routes to School Project' that will consist of sidewalk improvements to provide a pedestrian walkway to Willow Springs School. The project is currently in design and will entail additional sidewalk to the south, west and east. The most exciting component will be pedestrian access across the ravine at Vinewood Avenue. The Village committed to completing this project, working through several re-design applications to comply with federally- funded aspects of the project. This access will compliment and link the School Drop-off Zone along Vinewood Avenue which the Village funded in 2006. Another 'Safe Routes' project installed sidewalks in 2012 along the path to Pleasantdale School, along German Church Road and School Street.

A new Village-owned parking lot for Metra commuters is currently in design stages, with the goal of construction in the spring. The Village reviewed multiple conceptual plans to ensure that the needs of the community were met. The selected plan will help complete the Village Center area and provide additional off-hours parking for future business growth. The improvements will provide closer access to the Metra Station, safety improvements and additional landscaping to the Village Center.

The West Suburban Water Commission has two water main improvement projects planned in the Village this year. The water main along Cedar Street will be replaced from Forest Street to Elm Street. Spring Street will also receive a new water main from Archer Avenue to Blackstone Street. The Village plans to work with the Water Commission to time its planned road paving improvements along Cedar Street with the water main installation. Cedar Street has been identified as one of the Village's highest priority roads in need of repair. An additional water main project is planned for Hill Street, from Blackstone to Archer. Again, the Village addresses any necessary road maintenance at the same time to economize resources. The Water Commission continues to improve water service lines in the Village, having recently completed the removal and upgrade of the final four-inch main on its system.

**The Village, in conjunction with the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District**, is approaching the bid stage for Phase Two of a drainage project along the Ravine Watershed route. Last fall, in the initial phase, the Village improved the alleyway between Hill and Springs streets in advance of the MWRD phase which will manage storm water draining down from the higher elevations of the Forest Preserves.

As part of a separate Stream bank Stabilization project, the MWRD is already underway with improvements along Poston Road where the banks of the Cal-Sag Channel are being restored from major erosion.

Left turn lane improvements along Archer Avenue began in March with the Illinois Department of Transportation planning to complete work by mid-June. Please be prepared for occasional lane closures as the project progresses in coming weeks.



## **Fire Department News** *Tri-State looks back at 2014, plans for future*

Tri-State Fire Protection District continues to evaluate capabilities and upgrade performance to provide the best possible fire and emergency medical service. In 2014, Tri-State FPD activated one of three new 2015 Ford 450 Ambulances (with a Wheel Coach Box) into its fleet. The other two Ambulances will be added into service later this year.

Tri-State FPD continues to handle all repairs and maintenance internally, for all fire department vehicles, to control quality and costs.

The Tri-State's Fire Prevention Bureau relocation, from Darien to Willow Springs, is now complete; the Bureau's two Inspectors/Fire Investigators and Administrative Assistant now share half the firehouse space at 8259 Willow Springs Road. Among many things, the Bureau inspects all business properties, investigates all fires and reviews plans to new buildings for tenants wishing to occupy space within the district.

The Fire Prevention Bureau has inspected many of the businesses in Willow Springs, and is on target to complete a full inspection of all structures. Tri-State's goal, as a Fire Department, is to ensure Willow Springs residents' safety and peace of mind.

\*In 2014, The Willow Springs Station responded to 568 EMS/Fire Rescue calls for Willow Springs residences and businesses.

Tri-State is proud to announce that in December 2014, the Fire Prevention Bureau was honored with two "Fire Investigators of the Year" awards for providing evidence resulting in the arrest of a subject on a "Class X Felony" Arson Charge.

As a part of the Village community, Tri-State FPD participated in many of the Willow Springs events last year including: the Children's Fishing Derby, Easter Egg Hunt, Halloween Party, "Chatting with The Chief" School Program, the Benefit Car Show, The Tree Lighting Party at Village Hall, and the Christmastime Santa Run.

<u>Please mark your calendars for October 2015, when the Fire Department holds its Annual Fire</u> <u>Department Open House, at 8259 Willow Springs Road</u>. Bring the kids to enjoy a close-up look at the Firehouse and Equipment. The exact date and time will be announced via the Newsletter, Village signs, the Village website, and Facebook page. We look forward to seeing you there.
