Just about a year ago, after changing our Fire Department service from part-time to full-time firefighters, the Village's fire protection rating climbed from its existing "9" rating, to a "3." That change occurred due to upgraded equipment, staffing and general readiness of our firefighters. Today I am pleased to announce that Willow Springs' rating has achieved a rating of "2," the highest residential fire rating attainable. Besides lowering insurance premiums for business owners and residents alike, the bottom line is our residents are assured of the best possible firefighting and ambulance service when seconds count. Congratulations to the dedicated team of professionals at Tri-State and the Black, Gold and Red divisions who work out of our firehouse at 8259 Willow Springs Road.

The Village continues to move forward with initiatives to improve the quality of life for local residents while working within the balance of nature that blesses our community. Last month, the Village learned it is one of a handful of communities selected to receive a planning and technical assistance grant to better accommodate pedestrian and bicycling traffic in our area. Active Transportation Alliance will work together with our staff for the next 18 months on goals that will connect existing and plan additional bike trails and pathways. The "walkability" of a community is one of the criteria that many home shoppers research when deciding where to live. Trails and walkways further enhance property values. It is also another option for residents and visitors to access local businesses and amenities.

Thank you all who helped make the 2015 Illinois State Road Championships a great success last month. More than 500 bicycle riders and their families participated in the races July 19, bringing more positive exposure and consumers to Willow Springs. Thanks to our Public Safety team that kept traffic moving smoothly and ensured the safety of participants and spectators.

Please be sure to come out to support our Annual Benefit Car Show on Thursday, August 7, from 4 p.m. until 9:30 p.m. in the Village Center. Live music, grilled food and beverages will help you enjoy the 400-plus show cars this event attracts. Beneficiaries this year include: Honor Flight Chicago, Wounded Warrior Project, our American Legion Post 832, and Viet Nam Veterans of America. Free shuttles will run continuously from the Willowbrook Ballroom, 8900 Archer, and from Our Lady Mother of the Church, 116 Hilton. Local businessman, Mike Lavery, brings his "Whiskey Road Band" to entertain the crowd of around 3,000.

If you have a taste for locally brewed beer, or simply want to listen to music and enjoy a selection of food, the Midwest Brewers Fest will host more than 50 area brewers and 3 live bands from 1 p.m. until 5 p.m. on Saturday, August 22, in the Village Center. Proceeds from this 501c3 organization are donated to charity.

ISO rated the **Tri-State Fire District a Classification 02**. ISO ratings help establish appropriate fire insurance premiums for residential and commercial properties, insurance companies need reliable, up-to-date information about a community's fire-protection services. It also collects information on municipal fire-protection efforts in communities throughout the United States. In each of those communities, ISO analyzes the relevant data using our Fire Suppression Rating Schedule (FSRS). We then assign a Public Protection Classification from 1 to 10. Class 1 generally represents

# **GOT DIAPERS?**

#### **DO NOT flush diapers (all adult and child varieties) and personal hygiene products down your toilet**. These items MUST be put in your garbage can.

Diapers block the sewers, causing damaging and messy backups in yours, and your neighbors' homes. Please educate yourself and remind your family members that this is causes unnecessary costs and headaches for everyone in your area. Please do the right thing.

#### Also be reminded:

- Properly dispose of household grease from meat fats, lard, baking goods, butter and margarine, cooking oils, food scraps, sauces and dairy products by collecting these substances in a container and throwing them in your garbage can.
- Fats, oils and grease can build up in pipes, preventing your wastewater from making its way through the sewer pipes. When your wastewater is unable to move through the sewer pipes, raw sewage can back up into your home or yard or overflow into local streets and streams.
- Bulky items like diapers and hygiene products can also clog pipes, causing backups and overflows of sewage into streets, homes and streams.
- Never flush or pour household chemicals like cleaners, medications, auto fluids, used motor oil, paint or lawn care products down a drain.
- Hazardous chemicals can cause significant damage to sewer pipes and diminish the effectiveness of the wastewater treatment process. Pesticides, solvents and other cleaning materials can corrode plumbing and release toxic fumes through the sewer system. In addition, chemicals and contaminants that are not removed from the wastewater during the treatment process will be released into local streams along with the treated wastewater.

### Willow Springs arms seniors with information to fight scams

Willow Springs senior citizens learned firsthand last week about a scam that can literally steal your home right out from under you.

A "Senior's Outreach," sponsored by the Village and Recorder of Deeds Karen Yarbrough, signed up dozens of local seniors as part of a "Property Fraud Alert" system. By signing up, seniors now will receive emails, texts and telephone notification if there is any activity on their real estate deeds. A new scam targets homeowners by illegally making



changes to property deeds, sometimes costing rightful owners their homes.

The Village took the proactive step of mailing notifications to senior residents who are often targeted for illegal activities. Safety advice and information also was provided at the Outreach by the Willow Springs Police, Tri-State Fire District, Public Works Department, Clerk's Office and legal counsel. Speakers reviewed services available to prevent residents from becoming the victims of scams. Springtime especially, according to News safety officials, is prime time for an assortment of neighborhood scams.

Lyons Township Assessor Barbara Weyrich also participated at the Outreach, explaining programs available to Township seniors. The Assessor's Office, in conjunction with Mayor Alan Nowaczyk, have hosted "Property Tax Outreach" sessions every January at the Willow Springs Senior/Community Center for the past half-dozen years. At these sessions, homeowners learn how to fill out and file tax appeals and take steps to lower their property tax bills.



The Property Alert presentation was the latest in a series of outreaches aimed at protecting seniors and others. Previous outreaches at the Senior/Community Center, 8156 S. Archer, have included: a signup program for the Village's "Reverse 9-1-1" system in coordination with the West Suburban Water Commission, a "Smart 9-1-1" cell phone registering system with Tri-State Fire Protection District, and an "Internet Safety" program with Keep-it Inc.

"These programs complement our Public Safety departments"

efforts by educating seniors and others to create an informed, alert public. This is crucial to maintaining a safe, thriving community, "said Mayor Nowacyzk.

The Village's emphasis on public safety has not gone unnoticed. In April 2014, the Village earned the recognition as



the "Safest Suburb in the Southland" area based on FBI crime statistics in a report from the organization SafeWise.

Nowaczyk noted that not only seniors, but any homeowner can register their property for the Property Alert System offered by the Recorder of Deeds. A link to the program is on the Village's website at: www. willowsprings-il.gov.




