March 15, 2016 Referendum On Future Fire Protection Services Provider

- ► Municipalities provide firefighting and ambulance services either through an in-house Fire Department controlled by the Mayor/Board of Trustees or through a multi-village Fire Protection District controlled by an independently elected Board of Trustees.
- ▶ In 2006, the residents of Willow Springs voted against increasing expenditures for new equipment and vehicles for our in-house Fire Department. Factors at the time included rising costs of salaries, benefits, pension obligations, equipment, safety clothing and gear for all firefighters, paramedics, and engineers. For the next 7 years, the Village explored alternatives to operating an in-house Department.
- ▶ In 2013, the Village of Willow Springs signed a contract with the Tri-State Fire Protection District to provide firefighting and ambulance services to our residents, for a 3-year evaluation period. This final year of the Tri-State contract costs \$575,000 and expires September 30. Tri-State has offered the Village the opportunity to become a full member of its District. Tri-State's tax rate for 2014 was 0.7389. For comparison, the other two contiguous Fire Districts, Pleasantview and Roberts Park, are 0.842 and 1.070, respectively. Additionally, Tri-State's ISO 2 rating places it in the top 1 percent of fire protection providers in the nation.

Choice 1: To staff and equip an in-house Willow Springs Fire Department, comprised of full- and part-time firefighters, would require a property tax increase to pay all day-to-day operating costs estimated at roughly \$2,000,000 per year; plus additional bond debt to replace obsolete equipment, estimated at \$1.5 million to \$2.0 million.

Choice 2: Joining the Tri-State Fire Protection District would establish a new property tax line item for our proportional share of the District's annual budget. The Willow Springs portion of the District's annual budget will be \$1,200,000.

The question on the March 15, 2016 ballot reads as follows:

"For joining the Tri-State Fire Protection District and assuming a proportionate share of bonded indebtedness, if any." If you support Choice 1, vote "NO". If you support Choice 2, vote "YES".

Why do I need a Vehicle Sticker?

-- Vehicles stickers help our Police patrol your neighborhood, know who belongs, and keep it safe. Anyone who lives in the Village or houses a car in the Village is required to purchase a sticker.

What do I need to purchase a Vehicle Sticker?

-- <u>Your Renewal Card</u> received in the mail, and \$30 for the sticker or \$47.50 for a B-plated truck.

What if I do not have a Renewal Card?

-- Bring your Vehicle Registration

Train Schedule: The Heritage Corridor line leaves Willow Springs at 6:09, 6:49 and 7:32 a.m. and returns to Willow Springs at 5:23, 5:58 and 6:45 p.m. Mon. - Fri. The line runs from Joliet to Union Station in Chicago.

Train Tickets: Tickets for the train are done directly through Metra. The Village Hall does not sell train tickets.

Parking: Parking per day at the Willow Springs Metra Station is paid through <u>PassportParking Mobile Pay</u>. If you prefer to pay for parking on a monthly or 6-month basis, monthly parking permits are available at the Willow Springs Village Hall. There is no overnight parking available.

What is PassportParking Mobile Pay?

PassportParking is a new cashless, mobile payment parking application that allows drivers to skip the trip to the meter and pay for parking directly from their mobile phone.



Registering for PassportParking:

Before parking for the first time, you must register for PassportParking. To register, download the PassportParking app and then follow the instructions on the app. If you do not have a smart phone, register online at passportparking.com/park, using Facebook, or by calling the local number listed on the meter.

Paying for daily parking using PassportParking:

Pay by App – The PassportParking app allows users to start or extend a parking session, add or update payment card details, electronically validate their parking, as well as manage notification and receipt options.

Pay by Web – The same app functions are also available on the mobile website, <u>m.ppprk.com</u>. In addition, the website allows users to view and print individual or sets of their previous parking transactions.

Pay by Voice – No smart phone? No problem! To Pay By Voice, dial 847-380-4332 and follow voice prompts to complete the transaction. First-time users will need to enter credit card information using the phone's keypad. To extend a parking session, users can call back and manage their existing session.

Pay by Text – To Pay By Text, text the Zone number (Zone Number is 60480), Parking Space Number, and the amount of time you wish to stay in the following format: ZoneNumber*SpaceNumber*Time to 847-380-4332. Users will receive a confirmation text letting them know they've successfully paid for parking. Note: Users must be pre-registered with PassportParking to utilize Pay By Text.

Village Joins Complete Streets Initiative

Mayor Alan Nowaczyk and the Village Board voted unanimously to join the National Complete Streets Coalition at the Board Meeting on January 28, 2016. Willow Springs is home to miles of scenic trails connecting people to each other and to the natural beauty of the Village, and the Village desires to ensure environmentally friendly modes of transportation for residents and visitors alike. By adopting a Complete Streets policy, the Village pledges to direct our transportation planners and engineers to routinely design and operate the entire right of way to enable safe access for *all* users, regardless of age, ability, or mode of transportation.

This means that every transportation project will make the street network better and safer for drivers, transit users, pedestrians, and bicyclists – making our village a better place to live. Making these travel choices more convenient, attractive, and safe means people do not need to rely solely on automobiles. The Village strives to maintain its identity as a friendly, close-knit community which offers recreational outlets to promote fun, healthy lifestyles, and creating a safe, connected network of transportation is how we play to do that.



<u>IMPORTANT:</u> License Plate Renewal and Emission Testing Notices

The Illinois Secretary of State will no longer mail license plate renewal notices AND the EPA will not mail emission test notices. The easiest way to avoid penalties is to sign up for e-mail notices at https://www.ilsos.gov/LicenseRenewal/. The email you receive for your plate renewal will also include whether or not a Vehicles Emissions Test is required.



To register for email notices, you will need:

- Your registration ID and PIN (found on your current registration card).
- Your insurance agency, policy number, and expiration date.
- Payment.

* Remember to print out your transactions receipt. If you renew online *before* your previous registration expired, the receipt shows proof your registration has been renewed. This receipt is valid for 30 days after your previous registration's expiration date.

Quick Facts about Branch Pick Up

- Branches must be on *your* easement, not in the street
- Meant for routine maintenance and pruning, not full or parts of trees
- Branches can be no more than 3" in diameter & 6' in length
- Chipping is limited to 10 minutes per residence
- Pine trees are not able to be chipped by Public Works due to the sap on the branches
- Yard waste cannot be mixed with branches. Mixing yard waste with branches will break
 down village equipment. Public Works will not pick up branches if they are mixed with
 yard waste.

All remaining branches may be disposed through Groot Recycling in the brown waste bags with a lawn waste sticker. The stickers can be purchased at the Village Hall for \$2.70 each. Please store larger branches in your yard so they may be chipped in the spring.

HELP FIGHT WEST NILE

Mosquitoes carrying the West Nile Virus primarily come from standing water around your home. It doesn't take much water for mosquitoes to develop. You can take the following simple steps to eliminate potential sources:

- ✓ Throw away all trash that can hold water (cans, jars, bottles, etc.)
- ✓ Clean rain gutters and downspouts to prevent water from standing in gutters or on flat roofs
- ✓ Change water in bird baths, wading pools, etc. at least once a week.
- ✓ Maintain swimming pools properly
- ✓ Keep ditches and streams on or around property free of grass clippings, garbage, and other debris to insure proper flow
- ✓ Stack pails, barrels, tubs, wheelbarrows, and similar containers upside down
- ✓ Clean out and fill tree holes
- ✓ Stock ornamental ponds with goldfish or other surface-feeding fish
- ✓ Dispose of used tires properly

Tips on Crime Prevention from your Police Department



Crime Prevention and suppression cannot be the sole responsibility of the Police Department. It is critical that each individual resident and business owner take steps to assist in the prevention of criminal behavior/activity.

Many crimes occur when persons with criminal intent are presented with the **OPPORTUNITY** to realize their goals. The Crime Prevention process is intended to remove or lessen this **opportunity**. The Police Department contributes to this effort by visible and vigilant patrol, but this alone will not eliminate criminal activity.

There are four principles of residential security that if applied, will dramatically reduce your chances of becoming a victim. The four principles can be described as the four D's - **Deter, Delay, Deny, and Detect**.

DETER is the core element of opportunity. This involves several techniques mainly targeted toward the exterior of the residence. These are designed to make your home a 'risky' target. These include lighting, signs, and your immediate environment in general and the most important being community involvement in calling the police when something suspicious is seen. The sooner the police are called, the sooner the suspicious or criminal activity can be investigated and addressed.

DELAYING the criminal. Make it hard for a criminal to break in. The longer it takes for a burglar to break into your home the more chance the criminal has of being caught, and the burglar knows this. If a resident can delay the criminal's entrance for at least four to five minutes, it is generally sufficient to prevent entry. These tactics include door and window locks designed to resist entry.

Criminals are looking for easy, quiet and timely entry. If the burglar is neither deterred nor delayed then to **DENY** the criminal access to your valuables is the next consideration. These strategies include marking household property, using a safe, and keeping inventories and disbursement of valuables.

Finally, **<u>DETECTING</u>** the criminal is obviously an important piece of the puzzle. Detection involves devices such as alarms, neighborhood watch, and even dogs.




