Building on Village Easements Prohibited

Easements are the legal designations that allow individuals or entities, such as the Village, to use portions of your property. Residents are responsible for maintaining their own easements.

Public Works

Branch Chipping – Alternating Mondays until September

The last day for branch pick-up is September 19 (South Side) & September 26 (North Side). Branches need to be at the Easement by 7 AM on YOUR Monday. AFTER SEPTEMBER: All remaining branches MUST BE DISPOSED OF via YARD WASTE STICKERS available at Village Hall. OPTIONALLY: You may store larger branches in your yard for PICKUP NEXT SPRING.

Fall Leaf Collection Begins in October on Alternating Mondays

Beginning October 3: South Side – 1st & 3rd Monday / North Side – 2nd & 4th Monday

Pile leaves on your easement by 7 a.m. on Monday. DO NOT pile leaves in the street. It is a potential safety hazard for vehicles and pedestrians. DO NOT pile leaves on any of the storm sewer inlets. This causes blockage, backup, and flooding.

Mixing It Up Damages Machinery

Yard waste, leaves, and branches CANNOT be mixed. This damages Village equipment and you may be liable. Each material requires specific equipment for pick-up. Mixed piles WILL NOT be picked up by Public Works.

Got Diapers? Please Dispose of Properly

Flushing diapers down toilets back up sewers on your block and in your neighbors' homes. Do not flush diapers down the toilet. Be responsible and educate yourself and your neighbors.

5th Grade Egg Drop

Public Works Dept. and the West Suburban Water Commission teamed up for the "5th Grade Egg Drop" at Willow Springs School on May 16. Students created many unique and imaginative designs to safely protect their eggs from a fall. To test the designs, Public Works dropped students' carefully-packaged eggs from the top of their bucket truck. Many students' eggs survived, but some did not! Nonetheless, there were many creative constructions and students learned a lot. Congrats to all!

Village continues initiative to develop recreation, industry along "Green Corridor"

The Village continues to work to plan development proposed for its "Cal-Sag Green Corridor," a 100-plus acre tract along the Cal-Sag Channel reaching out to its western borders past Route 83.

The Village annexed this tract in 2011 with the vision of providing a planned mix of improved recreational facilities and industrial development. This initiative has involved extensive planning and negotiations with multiple governmental and private stakeholders.

The immediate effect of the annexation allowed the Village to take adds part of a marina west of Route 83, along with a cement product industry. The Village already had a stable industrial tenant, Rowell Chemical, located within its original borders. Rowell's parent company, Gardner Asphalt, is located just east of the Rowell plant.

"The area that reaches out to Route 83 holds great promise for the Village and other stakeholders alike," said Mayor Alan Nowaczyk.

The 2-mile tract holds the challenge of being fairly shallow in depth, its access to barge, rail and trucking provide a unique development opportunity.

Bringing additional light industry along the Cal-Sag is a key component of the Village's goal of reducing the property tax burden on local families, the mayor said. Adding additional development carries with it the responsibility to properly plan to ensure compatibility with existing recreational uses, he added.

The Village hopes to enhance recreational value to its "Green Corridor" by adding the availability of water, parking and easier access to the bicycle and pedestrian trail system. Those goals involve coordination with stakeholders including the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District (MWRD), the Cook County Forest Preserve (CCFPD) and the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT), among others.

*IDOT's roadwork on Archer Avenue is scheduled to be completed by the end of summer. Design changes have slowed progress on the state project and will include lane closures similar to those which occurred during the Willow Springs Road Bridge reconstruction last year. The Village continues to encourage IDOT to expedite the completion of the project, add signage and address safety concerns created by last summer's addition of another southbound WS Road lane and the subtraction of a northbound lane.

*The newly constructed Village Center commuter nears final completion with landscaping and cross walks still to be added. The Village continues to await permit approval from the Canadian National railway which dictates work schedules along its lines. The Village applied for the permit approval last year and still has not been given access from CN to complete the project.

*After a three year process, the Village has finally received court approval to demolish the former Sma's hot dog stand at 8744 Archer. The business closed and the property has been in legal proceedings thereafter. The Village is proceeding with demolition plans for that site and another single-family structure at 8924 Archer.

Police Department

Summer Safety Tips for Homeowners, Drivers, and Parents

o Keep doors in your home closed and locked including your garage doors. An open door is an invitation.

• Alert police to any unusual activity, including suspicious vehicles in your neighborhood.

• During a vacation, have your mail and newspapers stopped or have a neighbor pick them up. Leave inside lights on timers to create the impression that your house is occupied.

• Be particularly alert to anyone in your neighborhood looking to perform home repair and asking to gain entry into your home. Ask to see identification and let them know you are going to call and get verification from their company before allowing them inside. If they are legitimate, they won't mind the wait.

- Do not leave valuables or cash in your car. If you must leave items in the car, lock them in the trunk.
- Provide a list of phone numbers of neighbors, family, and friends that your child can call in an emergency.
- Make sure your child knows how to dial 911and when it is appropriate to do so.
- Know the route your child will take to and from a given location.
- Make sure your child knows to never give out personal information on the Internet.
- Teach your child that there is safety in numbers and that it is best to be with a group of friends.
- Provide a bike helmet and require your child to wear it as well as brightly colored or reflective clothing.

No Overnight Street Parking

Overnight parking on Village Streets between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. is prohibited. Should you find it temporarily necessary to utilize the street for overnight parking such as repair of your driveway or outof-town guests, please notify the Police Department 708-839-2732.

Solicitors

Residents are reminded to be on alert for solicitors. Any person who goes door-to-door selling or requesting product, services, or information is soliciting and is required to register with the Police Department and Village Hall. The approval process requires them to get fingerprinted and a background check is conducted. This is for YOUR safety.

If a solicitor comes to your door, <u>do not open your door</u>. Through the door, ask for his or her soliciting permit from the Village. If he or she is unable to produce the official paperwork, state that you are not interested, lock your door, walk away and call the police (708) 839-2732.



Did you know:

On June 18, 1842, the area of Willow Springs was first settled on when George Beebe, a contractor working on the Illinois & Michigan Canal, bought an 80-acre parcel near what is now Archer Ave., just east of Willow Springs Rd.

In 1873, Mt. Forest was founded as an exclusive community for Chicago's richest residents when Col. Henry Dietrich and a Chicago businessman bought 300 acres on a hill just north of the canal. By 1877, the Village was a stagecoach stop that featured a general store, post office and telegraph office. It also was the first suburban community developed along the Chicago, St. Louis & Alton Railroad.

In the 1880s, residents of two growing communities decided to incorporate as one town to reap the economic advantages. On May 28, 1892, the Village of Spring Forest was formed by a vote of 30-0. Mayor John H. Winterburn presided over the first village board meeting on July 5, 1892.

In 1937, residents voted to change their town's name from Spring Forest to Willow Springs to create a new sense of identity, according to historical society president Jean Thode. Almost 175 years later and the Village remains a peaceful, tight-knit community.

Lions Club News

The Willow Springs Lions Club was Chartered in 1954 and has served the Willow Springs Community for 62 years. We were a Charter with 48 members willing to work to make Willow Springs a more progressive community. Our first community project was to build Lions Park which we maintained till 1983 when the Village of Willow Springs agreed to take over improvements and maintenance of the park. We continued to help building bathrooms in 1984 and the pavilion in 1992.

We now have 39 Members in our Lions Club that meets twice a month at three different restaurants in our community. June through September at Spring Forest Deli, October through January at Bonnie's Café, and February through May at Greco's.







NYFD hero visits The Irish Legend to dedicate the "Mickey Kross Snug"

Kross visited the Irish Legend on May 21 to dedicate a special room, or "snug", at the Irish Legend for firemen and first-responders. Kross is a survivor of what came be to known as "The Miracle of Stairwell B" when he, a company of firefighters and a rescued civilian, survived inside the collapse of the North Twin Tower on September 11, 2001.



During a brief speech to a gathering of local firefighters and well-wishers, Kross said he wears a pin marked "343" for the number of firefighters who lost their lives as a result of the September 11 attack. He told the audience to remember that the "tragedy continues" as more firefighters, policemen, emergency responders and workers, continue to lose their lives due to the effects of smoke and debris inhalation from the September 11 rescue and response.
