ULI Studies Cargo-Oriented Development in Willow Springs



ULI Chicago conducted a Technical Analysis Workshop on September 1st in Willow Springs to evaluate development opportunities for vacant sites located along the Sanitary and Ship, and I & M Canals. The workshop experts looked specifically at current and future industrial uses, options for integrating and optimizing transportation modes, and infrastructure improvements that will enhance development and amenities that already exist in the study area.

The Willow Springs Cargo-Oriented Development Workshop is an abbreviated panel format with briefing materials and background presentations, a site tour, stakeholder interviews, and panel recommendations presented to local representatives at the conclusion of the one-day meeting. The Workshop was presented in partnership with the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMAP) as a part of their Local Technical Assistance (LTA) Program. A written report will follow outlining panel recommendations. Watch for updates on the workshop outcomes in the coming months.

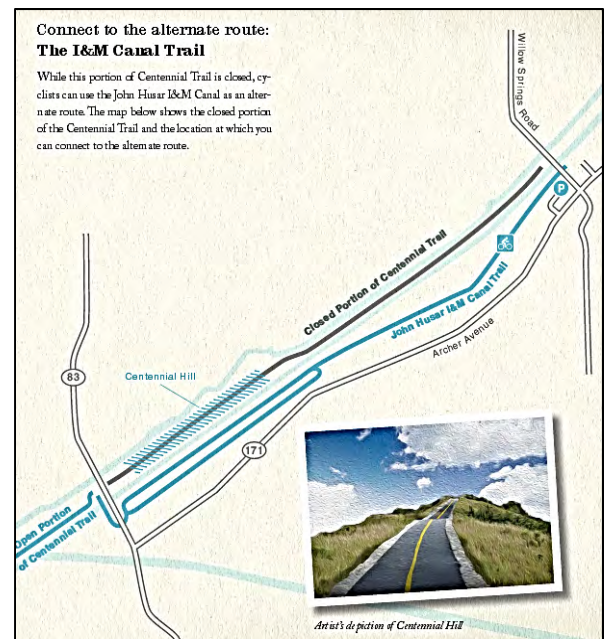


Bike Trail Closed, Transformed, and Open for Spring

It's been 2 1/2 years since the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District shut down the Centennial Bike Trail in Willow Springs. They've spent that time expanding the nearby McCook Quarry to serve as a giant water reservoir, providing flooding relief for the southwest side.



They also created Centennial hill - a 1.5 mile long and 60 feet high hill which gives riders a magnificent view of Downtown Chicago from the top! Improved rest areas and trail surfaces were also included in the improvement project. On October 17, the trail reopened with a ribbon cutting ceremony. Come spring, don't forget about to break out the bike and take a ride!



Rating Agency Announces the 50 Safest Cities in Illinois

Willow Springs ranked 11th Safest

The Village of Willow Springs is among the top dozen safest communities in the State to live in, according to *The SafeWise Report* released Nov. 9, 2015. SafeWise analysts considered public safety initiatives and the most recent FBI crime data from 2013 to rank cities of 5,000 or more population. Willow Springs earned the No. 11 ranking.



"We found many of the Illinois cities that made our list embrace the principles of community policing; citizens and law enforcement really work together to keep the community safe," SafeWise security analyst Alexia Chianis said. *"While the cities on this years' list are diverse, they all have a strong sense of community pride, impressive public safety initiatives, and top-notch municipal leaders who are doing everything they can to keep crime rates low."*

Local Mayor Alan Nowaczyk underscores that point. *"The focus of our Board and Departments is to provide a safe, family-values oriented community both to live in and to visit. Public Safety isn't just about crime fighting and putting a policeman on every corner. It's about keeping our residents informed and involved,"* Mayor Nowaczyk explained.

Initiatives such as the Reverse 9-1-1 telephone alert system, door-to-door police bulletins, guest speakers at Senior Center outreaches, and open houses to invite adults and children to witness police and fire demonstrations first-hand have been effective in keeping the Village safe.

A couple years ago, a local homeowner provided a partial license plate description that helped solve a home burglary ring that preyed on several surrounding communities and even crept into four homes in Village. The diligent homeowner called police after receiving a reverse 911 telephone alert of a burglary ring working the area and a follow-up police bulletin hand-delivered to his door.

More recently, the Village Board honored a delivery truck driver who had become aware of a scheme to swipe Christmas deliveries from doorsteps. While cooperating with local police to foil the package- swipers, the driver spotted suspicious subjects exiting a local home. His quick phone call to police netted two burglary suspects who were apprehended in neighboring Justice.

Police Chief Peter Kokkinis regularly draws upon a wealth of experience, education and knowledge from his more than two decades of police work in neighboring Bridgeview. He eagerly greets the challenge of administering the strictest standards of policing and setting goals to aspire to an even higher level of professionalism.

"Willow Springs is a very unique, friendly and tight-knit community. Generations who have called this Village home, as well as newer homeowners, all bring the highest expectations of a feeling of well-being and safety" Chief Kokkinis said. *"It is our Department's job to see that we meet or exceed those expectations every day."*

SafeWise is a nationally-recognized security organization that helps families and communities stay educated about safety and security in the home and on the go. It has been featured on Huffington Post, AngiesList, Mashable, and Homes.com. The organization aims to help users compare security options in an informative and pressure-free environment so they can make the choice that's right for their family. *The SafeWise Report* awards communities making the extra effort to excel at public safety, and helps inform both new residents and seasoned locals of the safety of their most cherished neighborhoods.

Village Continues to Improve Roads, Sewers and Drainage

Adding to its annual progressive schedule of road maintenance, the Village in 2015 addressed storm water maintenance and sewer system issues both North and South. Additional projects are in the planning stage for 2016.

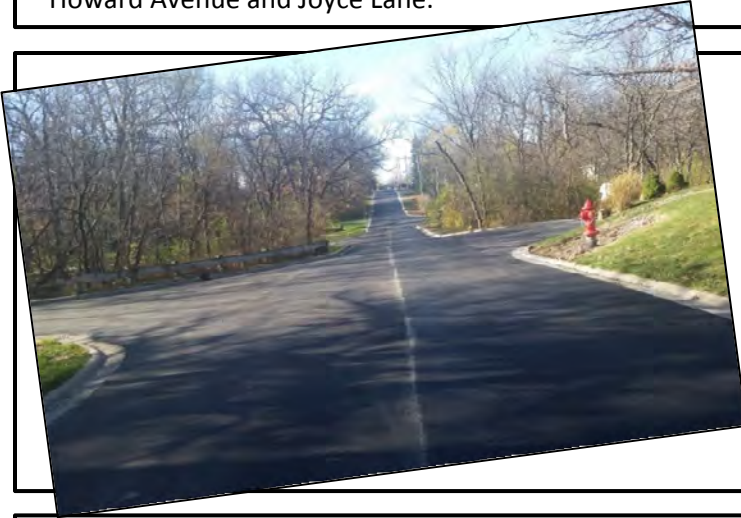
Bielby Subdivision Road Project

The project consisted of resurfacing four local roads totaling 0.75 miles. The construction of the roads included milling and resurfacing 2" of hot-mix asphalt surface pavement, subbase pavement repair in select locations, replacement of selected curb and gutter, repairing drainage structures, landscape restoration, and placement of pavement markings. The following roads were part of the project: Bielby Lane, 80th Place, Howard Avenue and Joyce Lane.



Cedar and Hill Street Road Improvements

The project consisted of resurfacing two local roads totaling 0.35 miles. The construction of the roads included milling and resurfacing 3" of hot-mix asphalt surface pavement, subbase pavement repair in select locations, replacement of selected curb and gutter, repairing drainage structures, landscape restoration, and placement of pavement markings. The following roads were part of the project: Cedar Street and Hill Street.



Crescent Court Drainage Improvements

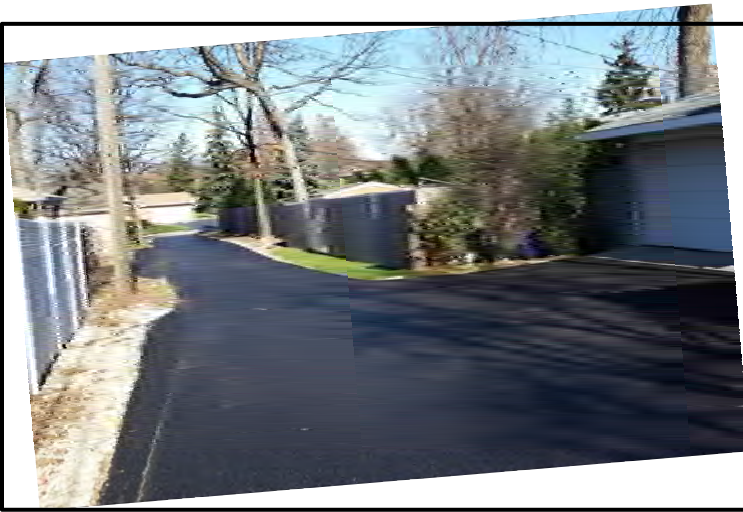
The project consisted of performing storm water improvements requiring removal and replacement of storm sewer, installing and adjusting drainage structures, grading and shaping a drainage ditch, installing erosion control measures and performing landscape restoration to all disturbed areas.



Spring Street Alley Improvements

The project consisted of grading and surfacing a stone alley. The improvements included placing a 2" hot-mix asphalt surface pavement, installing a concrete gutter to drain storm water, installing erosion control measures and performing landscape restoration to all disturbed areas.





Maple Alley Improvements

The project consisted of grading and surfacing a stone alley. The improvements included placing a 3" hot-mix asphalt surface pavement and performing landscape restoration to all disturbed areas.

Ravine Watershed Drainage Improvements

The project consisted of performing storm water improvements requiring removal and replacement of storm sewer, installing and adjusting drainage structures, grading and shaping a drainage ditch, installing erosion control measures and performing landscape restoration to all disturbed areas.



What Happens When it Snows?

1. **First**, main streets and main intersections are plowed and salted.
2. **Next**, public facilities, public parking and sidewalks for residents and school children.
3. **Then**, side streets and cul-de-sacs are cleared.
4. **Finally**, alleys are cleared.



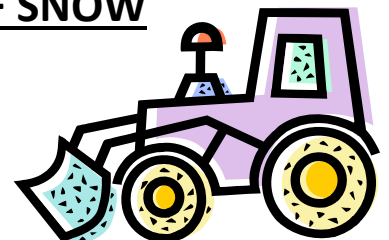
This prioritization allows the Village to provide plowing service in the safest, most efficient manner.

Public Works cannot be called to clear private property or driveways. Please be courteous to your neighbors and motorists; do not shovel snow back into the streets.

NO PARKING ON THE STREETS AFTER TWO INCHES OF SNOW

Ordinance 3-O-2008 and Title 11, Chapter 5D, Section 2(B) of the Village Code Book:

“Snow Removal: It shall be unlawful to park any vehicle on any public street in the Village at any time within twelve (12) hours after a snowfall of two inches (2”) or more has occurred.”

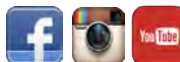

Village Constructs New Metra Lot, Additional Parking for Commuters



We are pleased to offer Heritage Corridor Metra commuters improved parking options. The new East parking lot is completed. Final walkways to the asphalt path and landscaping will be completed spring 2016.

Daily parking procedures have changed -- See information on Passport Mobile Pay below and visit <https://gopassport.com/faq/> for details. The cash box will no longer be available and daily parkers may only park in designated areas.

Monthly parking permits will still be available for purchase at the Village Hall for \$40. Monthly parkers will enjoy preferred parking in the new East Lot. If all of the monthly parking is taken, monthly permit parkers may park *anywhere* in the East or West Lots.

Zarzycki Celebrates A Century of Excellence

In 1915 Agnes Zarzycki, a 31 year old Polish immigrant, founded the first A. S. Zarzycki Funeral Home and became the first female funeral director of Polish descent in Chicago. Agnes Zarzycki was a graduate of Worsham Mortuary training School and opened her original location at 2532 S. Sacramento Ave. In 1962, they built a new funeral home on the corner of Archer and Keeler Avenues; it became known as Zarzycki Manor Chapels.



On April 11, 2007, Zarzycki broke ground for its second location at 8999 South Archer Avenue in Willow Springs, under the direction of the fourth generation of the family running the funeral home. On March 13, 2008 the beautiful, modern Zarzycki Manor Chapel officially opened for business. The Zarzycki Women truly dedicate their lives to improve their communities and offer many services to the residents, a tradition carried on since 1915.
